



Before going abroad: At the University of Trier

- o Check our Study Abroad website as well as the website of the International Office
- Inform yourself about the options: <u>Erasmus Study Abroad Booklet</u>
- Come to the information session
 Choose your university from the booklet
 - B.Ed. / M.Ed. students: Your obligatory 3 months stay has to be in an English speaking country; i.e. Great Britain, Ireland, North America, Australia.
 - (For information on studying abroad in North America or Australia, please check <u>Exchange outside of Europe</u>)
- Consider everything: How long do I want to stay (1 or 2 semesters)? Is it (financially) possible? Would I need a visum (Great Britain)? Etc.
- Apply via the International Office (<u>Bewerbungsunterlagen</u>)

Once you are accepted and are waiting for your letter of confirmation from your partner university (sometimes it will take some time):

Come to our (more in detail) information session for everyone accepted!







5. Accreditation at Master's Level

- 3rd-year undergraduate modules can be accredited for MA/MEd module grades
- Enrol in Master's before applying for accreditation (not while you study abroad)
- "LANG1001: Integrated Language Skills for Future Teachers" must be taken in Trier
- MEd "Staatsexamen" must be taken in Trier

(Module 12 M.Ed. Gym; Module 8/10 M.Ed. RS+)

- no accreditation of grades or exams for these modules
- components not relevant for the exam can be accredited



STUDY ABROAD

Are you looking for an interesting, worthwhile way of spending time abroad? Would you like to go to university in another country? Then you should consider applying for a study abroad exchange with one of the Department of English Studies' exchange programmes. This may be part of the Erasmus+ programme or a separate exchange within or beyond Europe. Whether you are studying English as your major or minor subject, or as part of your BEd/MEd degree, you're welcome to apply for any of these exchanges.

The benefits of participating in an exchange program are definitely worth it, particularly for language students! You'll get to know what it's like to be a student in another country and learn what the differences are to studying in Germany. This will help you broaden your horizons and gain a new perspective on things, within and beyond your degree subject. You will meet new people from all around the world, learn/improve your foreign language skills and see interesting, new places. Take the first step to becoming a new, more self-reliant person.

ERASMUS+ Partner Universities

Note that, despite Brexit, universities in the UK can continue to participate in the Erasmus+ programme until May 2023. However, you will need a passport to enter the UK, and a "student visa" if you stay there for longer than 6 months. You can check the visa information here: https://www.gov.uk/check-uk-visa For the time after summer 2023, we aim to create separate agreements with our UK partner universities that offer you comparable conditions to Erasmus+ exchanges (e.g. no tuition fees!); the difference is that your stipend would then come from a different programme (DAAD Promos).

The information booklet below will give you more thorough information on which universities are available for an Erasmus+ exchange through the Department of English Studies, the information you should consider before you apply, and how the application process works. 7. Excursion: USA & Canada

- Direct exchanges and ISEP program; programs for university-level teaching assistants
- Programs are managed by the International Office and generally open to all Uni Trier students
 - Application process can be competitive, with more applicants than available spots
- Students can generally take any undergraduate classes offered by host university
 - There may be a limit on number of classes or credit points, or on specific types of classes
- Scholarships available (DAAD; Fulbright) but programs may be pricier than Erasmus+


