- 1) Meet your Trier thesis advisor! Try to reach out in the first few weeks and set up a schedule of meetings with them.
- 2) E-mail the Fachschaftsrat Anglistik (<u>fsrangl@uni-trier.de</u>). This is our department's student council, and they will help connect you with a fellow student on campus (another master's level student) who can be your buddy.
