Research assistant (*wiss. Mitarbeiter*) at the project ‘The Prosody of Derived Words in English’, directed by Sabine Arndt-Lappe (University of Trier). The project is part of the research unit (*DFG-Forschergruppe*) ‘Spoken Morphology: Phonetics and Phonology of Complex Words’, coordinated by Ingo Plag (University of Düsseldorf).

The project investigates the extent and systematicity of stress-related variation on the basis of large quantities of data obtained from production experiments carried out under my supervision. The experiments have taken place at the University of Cambridge phonetics lab (in collaboration with Melanie Bell) and at the University of Manchester psycholinguistics lab (in collaboration with Patrycja Strycharczuk).
