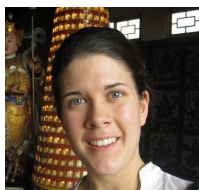


TAP Postdoc Team

Dr Josie-Marie Perkuhn 雷瑪麗 leads the joint postdoc research project Taiwan as a Pioneer (TAP) at Trier University and is non-resident-fellow at the Institute for Security Policy at Kiel University (ISPK). She graduated in Political Science and Chinese Studies. Her postdoc interest is in Maritime Security and Peace Studies, Digitalization, Climate Change, Energy Supply and Global Health. She is one of the 100-Top-of-the-Table on China-related matters as nominated by China.Table in 2024, and a member of the German-Taiwanese Dialogue Platform, DTDP.



Dr Amélie Keyser-Verreault 何梅俐 is a postdoctoral fellow affiliated to the European Research Center on Contemporary Taiwan at Tübingen University. Her research focuses on body politics and gender and sexualities with an emphasis on demographic trends, resistance and neoliberalism in East Asia.
