Dear applicants,

Before you apply for the Master's programme M.Sc. Economics, we would like to ask you to check, using the following checklist, if you fulfil our admission criteria.

PLEASE DO NOT APPLY IF YOU DO NOT FULFIL THE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS!

An eligible candidate must	have:

	A Bachelor's degree in Economics with an average grade of 2.7 or better according to the German grade system*
or	
I	A Bachelor's degree with at least 60 credits or 1/3 of all Bachelor's courses in Economics, Mathematics, and Statistics** and with an average grade of 2.2 or better according to the German grade system*
	Very good English language skills as proven by one of the following tests, which should have been taken within the last three years:

- TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) with at least a score of 80 in the internet based test or 215 in the computer based test or 550 in the paper based test
- IELTS (International English Language Testing System) with at least 6.0 points
- Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English
- UNIcert III
- C1 certificate according to CEF (Common European Framework)
 - Equivalent to one of the tests is proof of:
 - Native speaker coming from Great Britain, North-Ireland, Ireland,
 Malta, Canada, USA, Australia, New Zealand
 - Two years of full time study in an English taught program, in an English speaking country like Great Britain, North-Ireland, Ireland, USA, Malta, Australia, New Zealand and undertaken within the past two years
 - At least 5 school years of English in secondary education and at least 5 points in English at "Abitur" level (only Germany and Luxembourg)

* Formula for translation of a foreign grade point average (GPA) into a grade according to the German grade system:

[(G max - GPA) / (G max - G min)] x 3 + 1

G max – maximal grade according to the national grade system or to the official grade system of the home university

G min – minimal passing grade according to the national grade system or to the official grade system of the home university

GPA – grade point average of the Bachelor's or Master's degree

Example of grade translation:

1) The applicant comes from Belarus, his GPA of the Bachelor's degree is 8,49.

The maximal grade in Belarus is 10, the minimal passing grade is 1

$$[(10-8,49)/(10-1)] \times 3 + 1 = (1,51/9) \times 3 + 1 = 0,1677 \times 3 + 1 = 0,5031 + 1 = 1,5$$

The grade of the Bachelor's degree according to the German grade system is 1,5.

2) The applicant has graduated from the Azerbaijan State Oil Academy, his GPA of the Bachelor's degree is 78.

The maximal grade at the Azerbaijan State Oil Academy is 100, the minimal passing grade is 65

$$[(100-78)/(100-65)] \times 3 + 1 = (22/35) \times 3 + 1 = 0,6286 \times 3 + 1 = 1,8858 + 1 = 2,8$$

The grade of the Bachelor's degree according to the German grade system is 2,8 (this grade doesn't fulfil our admission criteria).

** Example of the courses allowed by us for 60 credits in Economics, Mathematics, and Statistics:

Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, Public Finance, World (International) Economy, Labour Economics, Environmental Economics, Political Economics, Industrial Economics

Econometrics, Mathematics, Linear Algebra, Discrete Mathematics, Game Theory, Statistics, Probability Theory and Mathematical Statistics
