shows a collection of instants of daily life and views of Accra, the capital of Ghana. Following the flow of water, the on-going urbanization processes are illustrated together with the socio-environmental effects on freshwater, wastewater, and the urban landscape as a whole.

Flows are at the core of urban processes. Water, people, food, infrastructure and waste circulate, and their movement entangle in a myriad of ways shaping life in the city and beyond. But a snapshot cannot catch a movement.

Drawing from the case of Accra, **WaterPower**, in collaboration with the University of Ghana, explores the intersections and dynamics of urbanization, resource governance, and global environmental change. WaterPower is a four-year research project based at the Governance and Sustainability Lab, University of Trier, and funded by the German Ministry for Research and Education. The project is led by **Prof. Dr. Antje Bruns**, head of the Governance and Sustainability Lab.
