Call for Abstracts

Under the theme of "Transformative Development Pathways – Critical Perspectives on Urbanisation, Land and Water", the WaterPower project invites you to participate in the project's final symposium. Hosted by the Governance and Sustainability Lab at Trier University, the event aims to connect participants for discussions and exchanges on what efforts in knowing and governing the urban may be needed for transformative change.

We invite researchers and early career professionals working across diverse sub-fields in Geography, Urban Studies, Development Studies, Environmental Sociology, Ecology, and related fields. The symposium will be held in English. The deadline for applications is **07 April 2019**.

About Our Theme, 'Transformative Development Pathways'

In five years of conducting research on Accra's urban waterscape, WaterPower has analysed water and urbanisation processes from a political ecology perspective. In doing so, we assume that progress towards sustainable development in which socio-ecological inequalities are reduced and water security is guaranteed, is inevitably linked to questions of power and politics.

The symposium's thematic sessions reflect the WaterPower research, connect different perspectives on urbanisation, land and water, and aim to explore critical perspectives on development pathways. Among others, we want to critically reflect and discuss recent political strategies that address Africa (Marshall Plan with Africa, BMBF Strategy).

Format of the Symposium

The symposium takes the form of a 2-day event with generous time for discussion and interaction built around the planned presentations. The event will host sessions covering the following themes:

- Water Governance, Institutional Bricolage and Hydro-Social Relations
- Water Practices in the Provision of Water
- Conservation Politics of Wetlands and the Articulation of Ecosystem Services
- Socio-Ecological Inequalities of Land and Water in the Peri-Urban
- Urban Water Futures

We envision an intense interdisciplinary dialogue and are determined to publish selected papers as a special issue.
