RAN away from her Master JOHN ROCK, on Monday the 18th Day of August Tast; a Negroe Girl named Thursday, about four and an half feet high, broad fett, with a Lump above her Right Eye: Had on when the run away a red Cloth Petticoat, a red Baize Bed Gown, and a red Ribbon about her Head. Whofo. ever may harbour faid Negroe Girl, or encourage her to flay away from her fald Matter, may depend on being profecuted according as the Law shall direct. And wholvever may be fo kind to take her up and fend her home to her fair Master, shall be paid all Coils and Charges, together with TWO DOLLARS Reward for their Trouble.
