Trier University represents many diverse aspects:

Founded in 1970 in Germany's oldest city, Trier University is a young and vibrant institution with roots dating back as far as the 15th century. Its focus on the Humanities and Social Sciences is complemented by the fields of Law, Business & Economics, Geography & Environmental Sciences as well as Psychology and Nursing Sciences. In total, there are six faculties covering more than thirty subject areas and several English-taught Master programs.



About 11% of the 12.000 students enrolled at Trier University are from abroad and numerous strong international partnerships connect Trier University with universities all over the world. The balance between teaching and research characterizes many of the courses and degree programs and interdisciplinary co-operation between faculties allow for multifaceted studies and interesting subject combinations.

Highlights

The **International Office** at Trier University offers a threeand-a-half-week orientation program before the start of each semester. The aim of the program is to prepare international students for studying at the university and to help them to settle into living in Trier. The orientation program has four key components: German lessons, the completion of important administrative formalities, various information sessions as well as social and cultural activities.



The **Language Center** offers more than 20 free German as a Foreign Language courses every semester. These courses are designed for different language levels and cover a variety of subject areas. They range from intensive courses for students with little knowledge of German (beginner level) to intermediate courses (B1, B2) and there are also specialized courses for students with advanced knowledge of German (C1, C2).

The student initiative "Internationales Zentrum" (IZ) offers international students an intercultural mentoring program as well as advice and guidance every semester. The IZ is not only there to help with all aspects of studies, but also organizes a varied program of social and cultural activities, such as a buddy program, language tandems, encounters with Trier locals or excursions.
