

## ERASMUS+ Travel Grant and Travel Days in 2025/26

Students who complete an ERASMUS+ stay abroad as part of the KA-131 funding project will receive the following travel allowances (one-off per stay) in addition to the ERASMUS+ monthly installments:

Travel Distance	Standard Trip	Green Travel
10 - 99 km	28 EUR	56 EUR
100 - 499 km	211 EUR	285 EUR
500 - 1.999 km	309 EUR	417 EUR
2.000 - 2.999 km	395 EUR	535 EUR

The travel distance is based on the direct distance between Trier and the respective destination (shortest route in accordance with the [EU distance calculator](#)).

**Green Travel** is defined as travel that uses low-emission modes of transportation such as bus, train, carpooling or bicycle for the main part of the journey to and from the university location (i.e. for more than 50% of the distances travelled; minimum requirement for carpooling: you use a car with at least one other person who is making the journey for his or her own purposes - i.e. not with the aim of taking you to or picking you up from the university – and who confirms this to you in writing). The *Green Travel* travel days can only be granted if the outward and return journeys taken together meet the above requirements; pro rata funding per direction is not possible.

*Please note:* Travel by non-low-emission means of transport is **not** considered sustainable even if CO2 emissions are offset.

In addition to the travel grant, you can apply for an ERASMUS+ grant for the days you need to travel to the host university or return to your home university. The grant amounts to 1/30 of the monthly rate for the student concerned per day of travel.

When using non-low-emission means of transport, a maximum of 2 travel days can be applied for, whereas for arrivals and departures that fulfil the *Green Travel* conditions described above, a total of up to 6 travel days can be applied for in order to cover any longer travel time resulting from the use of low-emission means of transport.

With regard to the number of travel days you request, please use the following scale as a guide, which is based on the direct distance between Trier and the respective destinations (see above). If you require more than the number of travel days specified here, please explain this in the space provided in the online data survey.

## Distances

- **Up to 99 km** (Luxembourg, Metz): **no travel days**
- **100 - 499 km** (Amsterdam, Antwerpen, Canterbury, Colchester, Louvain-la Neuve, Lüttich, Lyon, Maastricht, Nancy, Norwich, Paris, Straßburg, Utrecht, Wageningen) **und alle u. a. Ziele bei Nutzung nicht-emissionsarmer Verkehrsmittel** **up to 2 travel days**
- **500 - 1999 km** (Aarhus, Aberdeen, Alcalá, Almería, Athens, Bergamo, Bergen, Braga, Bologna, Bordeaux, Budapest, Bucharest, Cádiz, Cambridge, Chester, Córdoba, Danzig, Debrecen, Dublin, Falun, Florence, Gothenburg, Graz, Istanbul, Joensuu, Karlstad, Kraków, Kuopio, Lancaster, Lappeenranta, Limerick, Lisbon, Ljubljana, Łódź, Lund, Milan, Málaga, Maribor, Murcia, Mytilene, Nice, Oslo, Oviedo, Padua, Pisa, Porto, Prague, Riga, Rome, Salamanca, Salzburg, Sassari, Seville, Split, Stockholm, Tallinn, Tartu, Thessaloniki, Turin, Trento, Växjö, Valencia, Vilnius, Warsaw, Vienna, Zaragoza) **up to 4 travel days**
- **From 2000 km** (Rethymno/Crete, Tromsø) **up to 6 travel days**

All travel days applied for must be before the start of your studies at the host university or after the end of your studies there, i.e. additional travel day funding is not permitted for travel on the same day as the start of your stay at the host university and/or the return journey, e.g. on the last day of examinations.

If you receive a Green Travel top-up and/or an allowance for travel days, please retain your travel documents (tickets, receipts, booking confirmation, confirmations from fellow-travellers in case of carpooling etc.) for at least 24 months after the end of your stay in the event that there will be an audit.
