

Trier University, Germany, is recruiting for Faculty I – Education, Philosophy, Psychology – a

Professor of Practical Philosophy from the 20th Century to the Present, with a Focus on Ethics including Applied Ethics (m/f/d)

The post holder will represent the subject area “Practical Philosophy of the 20th Century to the Present, with a focus on Ethics including Applied Ethics” in both research and teaching. He or she will teach courses at the B.A. and M.A. level and therefore must have relevant teaching experience in the mentioned areas. The post holder will be expected to contribute to the development of Bachelor’s and Master’s degree programmes. She or he is expected to found the “Institute for General and Applied Ethics” which is currently in its initial stage of development. The ideal candidate has an international publication record in practical philosophy and has experience with acquiring third-party funding. He or she must be willing to collaborate with other professors in the department to develop interdisciplinary research projects and networks across Trier University. A track record of high quality research focusing on applied ethics as well as in the recent history of philosophy (from the 20th century to the present) is also expected. Competence in the field of political philosophy and the philosophy of law is desirable. The ability to teach courses in German is expected.

The official duties of this position are required by § 48 of the Rhineland-Palatinate Higher Education Act (HochSchG). The requirements for employment are derived from § 49 of the Rhineland-Palatinate Higher Education Act (HochSchG), which requires in particular that applicants prove pedagogical aptitude and outstanding academic performance. The application procedure and recruitment modalities are regulated by § 50 Par. 5 Sentence 5 and 6 of the Rhineland-Palatinate Higher Education Act (HochSchG). The state of Rhineland-Palatinate and Trier University advocate a supervision pedagogy for which it is expected that teaching staff have a strong presence on campus
