Buzz, Buzz.





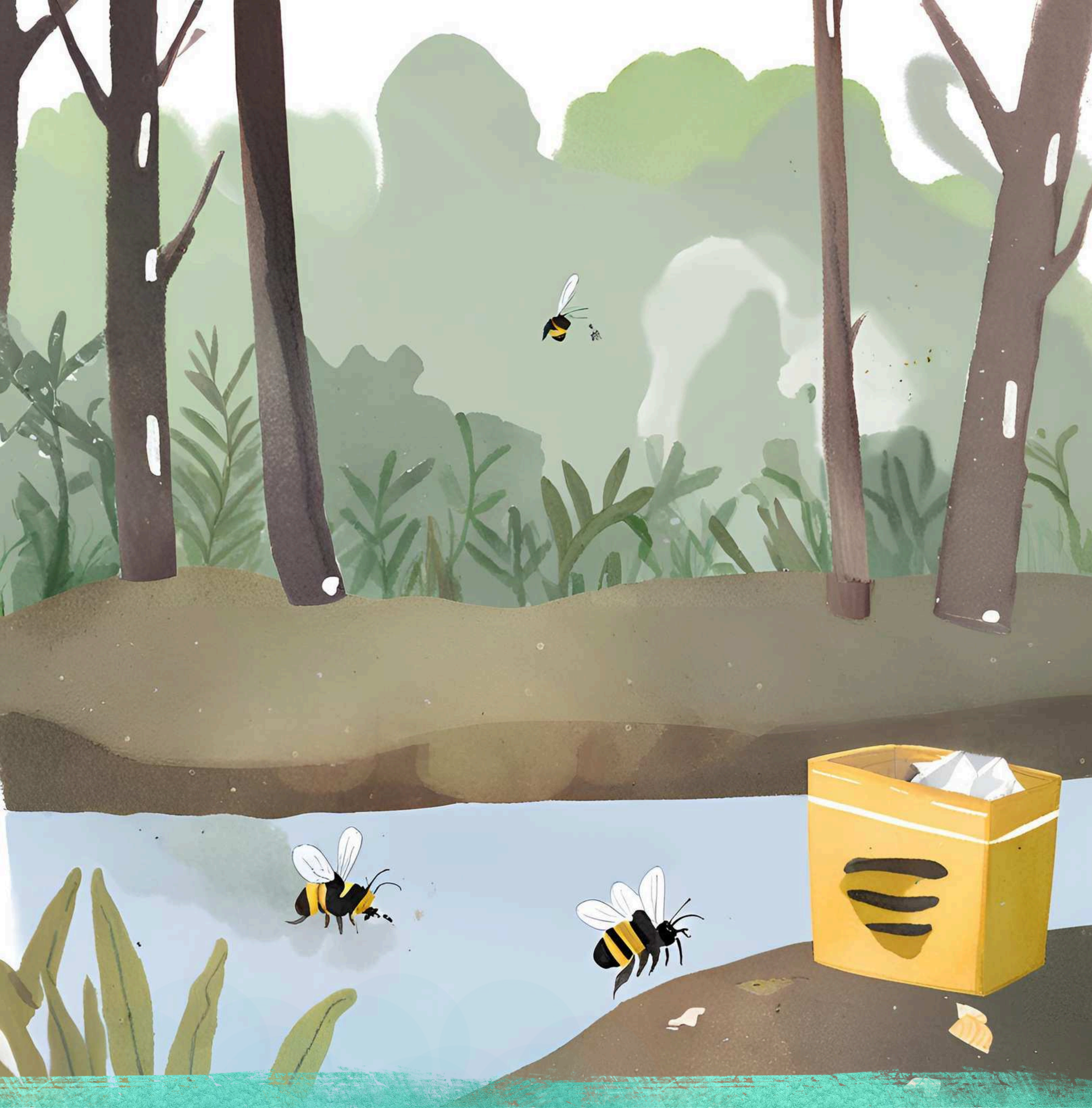
Oh, come and see! The humans have thrown their trash into me. Now all the fish and little creatures in my belly feel quite sick.
